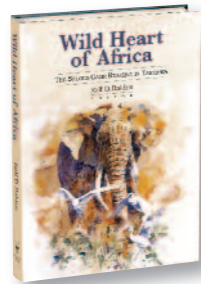


Rowland Ward's Wild Heart of Africa

Our new publication "Wild Heart of Africa – The Selous Game Reserve in Tanzania" has recently been launched on two

the German Agency for Technical Cooperation GTZ.

Both launches were well attended and a good number of the 25 Tanzanian and international authors, photographers, artists and cartographers, who had been assembled for this book, were present and addressed the audience. Amongst them were Erasmus Tarimo, Director of

Wildlife, Benson Kibonde, long time chief warden of the Selous, Gerald Bigurube, Director General TANAPA and Ireneus Ndunguru, a former Wildlife Division employee and MP. Mercy Njoroge, the wife of late Alan Rodgers, came from Nairobi. Other participants who travelled to the launches were Bodo Meier from Germany, who illustrated the book with his excellent watercolours, cartographer Mike Shand from Scotland as well as Ludwig Siege, who is now advisor of the wildlife authority in Ethiopia, Rudi Hahn and editor Rolf D. Baldus, who now lives in Bonn. Brian Nicholson, the last European warden and one of the "fathers" of the Selous, wrote from Australia that he would have loved to attend, but was unfortunately unable to due to



his age and sent this message: "I enjoyed reading the book and I wish you every success in marketing it."

The official address was by Dr. Ladislaus Komba, Permanent Secretary of the Tanzanian Ministry of Natural Resources and Tourism, who said: "I would like to thank the whole team for their effort and hard work and for making the "Wild

Heart of Africa" a reality. You have produced a wonderful book and you can be proud of your achievement. The book contains deeply researched and well-written articles on the history and the ecology of the reserve, on wildlife and trees and on tourism and hunting. The book is educative and entertaining at the same time. 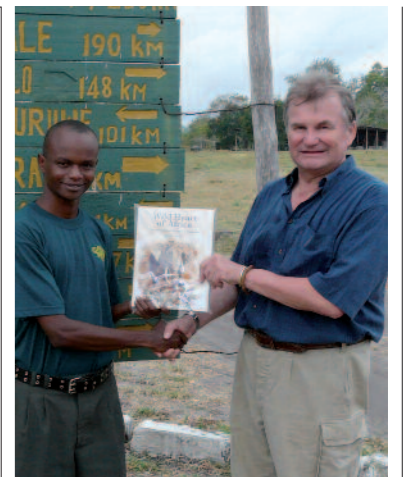

GTZ Country Director in Tanzania, and the editor.

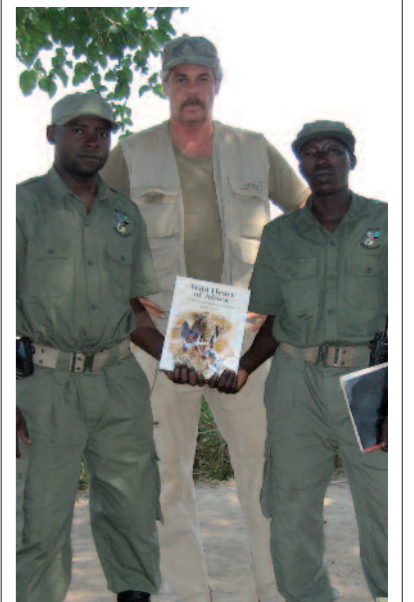
